MILWAUKEE, Aug. 28. (Exclusive)—Huey P. (self-styled Kingfish) Long, the usually volatile United States Senator from Missouri, remained more or less silently in seclusion in his room on the nine-story floor of the Hotel Schroeder here tonight. He was apparently nursing a wound on his forehead, close to the eye.

According to reports from New York, the rampant Huey received the injury from a well-directed punch aimed by a highly indignant Missourian, the name of whom is not publicly known. ROOSEVELT ORDERS SPEED UP ON N.R.A. SIGNERS' CREDIT

R.F.C. Head Told to Push Plan in Banks for Temporary Extensions; Public Works Pressure Looms

HYDE PARK (N. Y.) Aug. 28. (AP)—President Roosevelt speeded up his national recovery campaign today. He directed Jesse Jones, chairman of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation, to work out immediately a program for extending temporary credit through the banks to the members of N.R.A. to tide them over the sudden expansion of work and wages.
