"It's a boy, 7 1/2 pounds, and looks like a swell guy," Doctor Wilbur Ward reported mother and son "in excellent condition."

Several moments later, after having a brief glance at his heir, young Astor declared: "Gee, he's a swell guy."

It was considered probable that the baby will inherit the fabulous Astor fortune, most of which now is held by John's half-brother, Vincent, who has no children, although married twenty years.

COURT FREES CAFE MEN IN LIQUOR PROBE

Sebastian, Night Club Owner, and Aid Win Release From Legislative Contempt Charge

Dealing a smashing legal blow to the powers of the special legislative committee investigating liquor-control conditions, Superior Judge Ruben Schmidt late yesterday granted Frank Sebastian, Culver City night club proprietor, and his floor manager, Walter Pollock, freedom on writs of habeas corpus, thus releasing them of contempt charges for refusal to answer questions.

Fresh Riots in Berlin; Steel Helmet Chiefs Seized

By Arno Dorsch-Fleurot... BERLIN, July 19.—Shouting bands of Nazi rowdies and hoodlums stormed through the Kuferstuedendam district in Berlin tonight, searching for Jews, strengthened by the Nazi party's and Berlin Government's declaration of war today on all "enemies of the state."

Lashing out alike against Protestants, Catholics and Jews and against Communists and reactionaries, Nazi party and government chiefs at a meeting today ordered the "smashing" of all opposition in Germany considered threatening to National Socialist unity and methods.

DRIVEN TO COVER... The bands in the Kuferstuedendam tonight—the same types as those who rioted against Jews a few days ago—dared to cover what few Jews had frequent the cafes. The Nazis shouted: "Down with Jewish criminality!"
