As he went out of the temple he told his disciples that some day that beautiful building should be destroyed, and great troubles should come upon Jerusalem. He also said that some day he would return from heaven. His disciples asked him when he would come again. He told them that no one but his Father knew the time, and said, "Watch therefore: for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come." If we will watch fathfully, Jesus' coming will not take us by surprise, as a man is taken by surprise when a thief breaks into his house. When a master comes and finds his servant fathfully doing his work, he will reward him; but the servant who thinks his master is not soon coming, and who is unfaithful and wicked, the master, when he comes suddenly and finds him doing wrong, will punish. The way, to watch for Jesus is to do just what he would like to have us do.
