

U.S. wins its bid to deport L.I. war criminal

AN ALLEGED Nazi war criminal living on Long Island has been ordered deported by the Justice Dept., The Post has learned.

Officials in Washington will announce today that the Board of Immigration Appeals has reversed a judge's ruling last year preventing the deportation of Boleslavs Malkovskis of Mineola, sources said.

The 76-year-old retired carpenter has been

charged with helping the Nazis single out 20,000 Jews for execution in Latvia during World War II.

The Malkovskis decision was being announced after it was learned that Romanian Bishop Valerian Trifa — one of the leading alleged Nazi war criminals living here — left the U.S. Monday for Portugal.

Trifa, former head of the Romanian Orthodox Church in the U.S., was accused of touching off anti-Jewish riots during World War II in which 300 people were killed.
