CONDITIONS.

- 1.—This Telegram may, at the discretion of the Postmaster-General or any Telegraph Company or Government by whom it may be forwarded, be deferred in favour of full rate and press traffic.
 2.—This Telegram must be entirely in plain language. Plain language is such as, in the opinion of the Telegraph Service, bears an intelligible meaning on the face of it, and does not include a succession of numbers, names or words without connected meaning. Figures, abbreviated commercial expressions and commercial marks may be used in the text, but the total number of such groups must not exceed one-third of the chargeable number of words in the text and signature.
 3.—Either the Postmaster-General or any Telegraph Company or Government, by whom this Telegram is or would in the ordinary course of the Telegraphic Service be forwarded, may decline to forward the Telegram, although it has been received for that purpose; but in such case the amount paid for transmission shall be refunded to the Sender at his request.
 4.—Neither the Postmaster-General nor any officer of the Post Office nor any Telegraph Company or Government, by which this Telegram is or would in the ordinary course of the Telegraphic service be forwarded, nor any of the servants or officers of such Telegraph Company or Government shall be liable to make compensation for any loss, injury, or damage arising or resulting from non-transmission or non-delivery of the Telegram, or delay, or error, or omission in the transmission or delivery thereof through whatever cause such non-transmission, non-delivery, delay, error, or omission shall have occurred.
 5.—This Telegram shall be forwarded in accordance with the provisions of the Regulations with reference to Imperial and Foreign Telegrams made pursuant to the Telegraph Acts, and the provisions of such Regulations shall be deemed to be binding not only between the Sender and the Postmaster-General, but between the Sender and any Telegraph Company or Government by whom this Telegram is or would in the ordinary course of the Telegraphic Service be forwarded.
