There is not much news at this end. We haven't been able to get out to town for several days, but may get out again soon. I would like to go into New York City once more, anyway, here. I certainly enjoyed them.

It has really been cold here. The snow is gone, and has been gone for quite some time. Water in the ditches is frozen over all day long. We even wore overcoats on a hike today and they felt good. Of course, we do have clothing, bedding, and heating facilities to keep us warm so it isn't bad.

We get very good food here most of the time although we have had a few poor meals. As an average, though, the meals here are better than those at some of the other camps where I have been. The various units that eat in the mess

hall where we eat all have a certain time to eat and, therefore, we can go to the mess hall and go right in to eat without standing in line too long.

Mother, I am sorry that you are bothered with headaches, but if you got new glasses again you might cure the trouble. I hope that you can cure the headaches or correct the trouble a great deal because I know how irritating headaches can be.

How is Dad feeling now and how is work over at the depot?

Our unit still is not working as a unit in the capacity that it is organized for but we are getting a lot of exercise in the way of hikes, athletics, and calisthenics to keep us in shape.

before noon chow, wrote some more time  
after chow, and now that our afternoon  
class and athletics are over I can  
finish it.

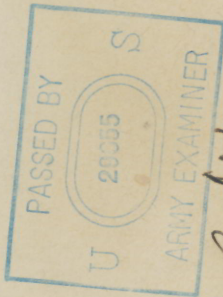
