INSIGNIA CHEVRONS OF NON-COMMISSIONED OFFICERS



The insignia of rank and rating of Coast Guard personnel are nearly identical with those in the Navy-the principal difference being that a shield is used as the distinguishing mark of the Coast Guard and appears on the shoulder straps and sleeves at the spoints where the Navy shows a five pointed star. Enlisted men wear this shield upon their sleeves in addition to their rank devices.


