
Madam:

Reference is made to your interest in the application for a permit to enter the United States in the case of Esther Burstein.

This case has been carefully considered by an Interdepartmental Committee, by an Interdepartmental Visa Review Committee and by the Board of Appeals in the light of the provisions of section 58.47 of the regulations covering the control of persons entering and leaving the United States pursuant to the Act of May 22, 1918, as amended. The conclusion has been reached that a favorable recommendation for the issuance of a visa may not be sent to the appropriate consular officer.

Section 58.57(g) of the aforementioned regulations provides that the Board of Appeals may not reconsider any case until after the lapse of a period of six months from the date of the previous opinion of the board in the case concerned, and section 58.57(f) provides that only the recommendation of the committees or board, without reasons therefor, shall be disclosed.
