

DPA SERIES: THE NAZI HOLOCAUST SERIES II — Pregnant women and most children went directly to the gas chambers. (In cases of childbirth, the child, if it survived, would be killed by the SS doctors. The mothers usually died of infection after being delivered.) The SS sometimes made selections among the children. The following is an eyewitness report: "During the selection of children, the SS men had placed a rod at the height of 1.20 metre. Children who had passed under the rod would be gassed. Small children, knowing only too well what was awaiting them, tried hard to push out their necks when passing under the rod, in the hope to escape gassing . . ." If a child survived it had to obey the same rules as the adults. (When the Soviet Army liberated Auschwitz, they found 156 children among the other prisoners.) In the above photo aid, a mother and two children were found among the dead at the Belsen concentration camp. April 18, 1945.
