



14 DPA SERIES: THE NAZI HOLOCAUST FAILED IN DENMARK — Early in 1943, England decided to aid the Danish Resistance by dropping supplies and instructors into Denmark. The Danes used the British aid efficiently, but weapons were always scarce. Members of the Resistance sometimes

resorted to disarming German soldiers on the streets in broad daylight. The Photo Aids above show an actual disarming taking place on a street in Copenhagen.
