

1 DPA SERIES: THE NAZI HOLOCAUST — The Nazis began phase two of their anti-Semitic policies, the "final solution of the Jewish question," shortly after World War II was declared. In Poland, Jews were rounded up from their villages, towns, and large cities and incarcerated in ghettos sealed off from the rest of the community by barbed wire and high walls. The Nazis hoped to decimate them by overcrowding, disease, starvation, forced labor, and property confiscation. In some ghettos the Jews resisted so strenuously the Nazis again rounded them up and resettled them elsewhere for "special treatment." Major General Jurgen Stroop (above) directed the forced evacuation of Jews remaining in the Warsaw Ghetto. April. 1943.
