



13 DPA SERIES: THE NAZI HOLOCAUST FAILED IN DENMARK — Supporting the Resistance during the Jewish rescue mission had an important psychological effect upon the Danes. It lessened their fear of provoking German reprisals and encouraged them to support the freedom fighters even

Copenhagen and cut off supplies of gas, water and electricity (June 26, 1944). The Resistance ordered a general strike which paralyzed the city. On July 5th the Germans restored services and promised to refrain from reprisals. The victory cost the Danes 87 dead and 664 wounded. The
