

DPA SERIES: THE NAZI HOLOCAUST — Well fed S.S. (Security Service) women were forced by the British army to remove bodies from trucks and throw them into communal graves. Belsen Concentration Camp, April, 1945. The occupation of Germany by the Americans, British and Russians revealed the full horror of the Nazi concentration camps. Buchenwald, Dachau, Auschwitz, Belsen, Bergen-Belsen, Mauthausen and Lublin-Maidanek were just a few of the more than 200 camps liberated by Allied troops, but life in all the camps was a form of living death. It has been estimated that at just two extermination camps (Lublin in Poland and Auschwitz in Silesia) more than 5,000,000 people were killed. The Commandant of Auschwitz, Rudolph Hoess, said in an affidavit that 3,000,000 prisoners were exterminated at his camp by December 1, 1943. After the Soviet Army liberated
