b. 1875, Weipert (Böhmen); studied theology and lectured at the Vienna university; for some time Rektor of Vienna University; enthroned Archbishop Vienna, Oct. 1932; Cardinal March 1933; was much hated by Nazis and Socialists for his active support of the Dollfuss-Schuschnigg Government; issued proclamation (after occupation of Austria) together with the other Austrian Bishops in support of the Nazi plebiscite, retracted after visit to Rome. b. 1890, Seehausen (Hannover); secondary school; wanted to become a missionary; trained as male nurse; studied medicine; 1914-18 war service; started writing; 1929 president of Nazi poets' organisation in "Kampfbund für deutsche Kultur"; Feb. 1933 dramatic adviser to Berlin State Theatres; travelled round the world; 1934 Prussian State councillor; 1935 President of Chamber of Literature; novels include: Der Kreuzweg 1921, Lieder der Sehnsucht 1924, So gehen sie hin 1930, Maske und Gesicht 1935, Ruf des Reiches 1940; famous saying: "When I hear the world culture, I slip back the safety catch of my automatic." JORDAN, Hans

General der Infanterie.

b. 1895, Heidelberg; 1914-18 volunteer; very distinguished service; awarded Pour le Merite; began writing 1920; descriptions of the war as a psychological experience; later political and philosophical; widely read in intellectual circles; at some time regarded as promoter of NS ideals, later as protagonist of the "Nationalbolschewisten"; never held office in Party; in 1933 arrested for short time on suspicion of collaboration with Otto Strasser (dissenting left-wing Nazi); served in 1939 and later; his latest books can be regarded as rejections of Nazi methods if not ideology; it is surprising that they were published; most important books: In Stahlgewittern 1920, Feuer und Blut 1926, Der Arbeiter 1932, Auf den Mar-mordenlippen 1939, Gärten und Strassen (War Diary) 1942.

Department for Foreign Policy; since 1936 as at present. LD 1942.

JUNG, Dr.

Ministerialrat; attached to Abteilung V, Reich Ministry of the Interior.

JUNG, Dr. Rudolf

Head of Reich Inspectorate for Man-power (under Plenipotentiary for Manpower); Gauleiter a.D.; SS-Gruppenführer; MdR.; Professor; Diplom-Ingenieur.

b. 1882; formed forerunner of NSDAP. in pre-1914 Austria; founded NSDAP. in Sudeten area of CSR. in 1931; this was prohibited in 1933; was then Gauleiter and leader of Nazi representatives in Czech parliament; general manager of Savings Bank in Prague; further career in German Labour Administration; former President of Landesarbeitsamt Mitteldeutschland; in Labour Ministry since 1942?; (SS-rank same year. LD 1944.

JUNGBLUTH

Regierungsdirektor; attached to Abteilung II (Higher Education), Rheinprovinz.

JUNGHANNS, Prof. Paul

Vice-president of the Reich Chamber of Fine Art; painter.

1913-19 medical practitioner in Frauenfeld; 1914-18 very short war service (suffered from TB.); Dr. in charge of 3 P.o.W. camps; 1919 TB. specialist in St. Pölten; 1932 joined NSDAP.; prominent in Nazi underground organisation in Austria; 1933-38; several times imprisoned; 1936 Austrian State Councillor; 1938 Austrian Minister for Social Affairs (Seyss-Inguart cabinet); Gauleiter Niederdonau; SS-rank since 1938. b. 1895, Mettnach (Oberösterreich); educated at secondary school in Linz and agricultural college Wien; engineer in a Forestry Division; later farmer; 1914 volunteered for active service on the Russian front; was taken prisoner in 1916 and exchanged in June 1918; demobilised as Leutnant; after the war farmer; came into the foreground in 1933 and 1934 as "moderate" Nazi agitator; was entrusted by Schuschnigg with the task of appeasing the Austrian Nazis, but worked secretly on the reorganisation of the NSDAP. in Austria; Minister of Forestry and Agriculture in the first Austrian Nazi Government; Staatssekretär since March 1940. LD.

REISCHACH, Hans Joachim, Graf von

Chief editor of "Zeitungsdienst Graf Reischach"; Reichshauptstellenleiter; attached to Reich Press Direction of NSDAP.
