Dear Mr. and Mrs. Gliksman,

I received two letters from you (dated by Saturday and Wednesday). At any rate, I am interested in your case in Court of Honor. Nowadays I am occupied with rewriting the files of your case.

In the next week I will be very busy with the hearing at the court. In the evenings I rewrite your files. I would like to ask you to come over to my place on Saturday April 2 at 4 o'clock in the afternoon. Of course please let me know in advance whether or not you will be coming.

Ten-day deadline to submit a list of witnesses is not precise. I believe that Saturday will be the best time to carefully study together the indictment. At the same time I am informing you about the receipt of the statement from Dr. Opatowski but unfortunately this statement has no probative value because it lacks a proper legal form. It is only a regular letter not a testimony. The most important is to submit typed statement to the Jewish Council in Italy. At the same time this Jewish Council should place there a proper stamp and also add a note (...) it is also important to have this statement written in Yiddish with Latin script. By the way we will talk about this on Saturday when you come to see me.

First of all please think about the list of witnesses, which you like to submit and they could be called for the hearing in the Court of Honor. Please provide their first name, last name and address). Please bring together the list of witnesses the indictment and other documents which you received and are good for purposes of defense. Besides the witnesses listed in the indictment, more people came to the Court of Honor Court willing to testify. One of them was Madowicz.

I also need to say that the explanations you rendered to the Jewish Council in Bad Manheim have not been noted so far.
