A Wool-Vest for a Half of Bread. This picture-story is known under the interchangeable titles: Fair Trade; A Cardigan for a Half of Bread. Leskley called it: A Hungry Old Woman Sells Clothing. It was commonly regarded that young and workable people received better rations in the ghetto than old and sick inmates. Not surprisingly a young girl on the picture is in a better shape than her fellow inmates of old age. Terezin, 1943.
