

# Board reverses ruling, orders ex-Nazi deported

The Board of Immigration Appeals has reversed a court ruling and ordered the deportation of an accused Nazi war criminal said to be re-

sponsible for the slaughter of 20,000 Jews in Latvia during World War II.

The ruling by the five-member board could end the eight-year fight by the Justice Department to deport Boleslavs Maikovskis, 77, of

Mineola, L.I.

Maikovskis has 60 days to take his case to the U.S. Court of Appeals. If he chooses not to appeal, he will be deported to the country of his choice if that country will accept him.

Maikovskis, who has indicated in the past that he would like to go to Switzerland, declined comment yesterday. He has denied participating in atrocities and attributed the charges to "Communist propaganda."

MEANWHILE, Romanian Orthodox Bishop Valerian Trifa, accused of inciting anti-Jewish riots that killed 300 people in Bucharest during World War II, was deported from the United States to Portugal.
