I nominate Jeffrey Mausner, Trial Attorney, Office of Special Investigations, Criminal Division, for a quality within-grade increase based on his sustained superior performance and promise of continuing superior performance.

Mr. Mausner was primarily responsible for making the government's case against Otto Alfred von Bolschwing, a high-level SD official. Mr. Mausner came across von Bolschwing's name in the course of another investigation, and gathered substantial evidence establishing that von Bolschwing obtained American citizenship illegally and fraudulently. The preparation of the case required diligent investigation and unusually sensitive discussions with intelligence agencies. Mr. Mausner drafted the complaint based on an atypical but sound legal theory and then took an active part, under my direct supervision, in discussions of possible settlement with defense counsel.

These negotiations culminated in von Bolschwing's surrender of citizenship on December 23, 1981, accompanied by von Bolschwing's formal admission that he had been a member of the Nazi party, the SS and the SD. This result avoided a lengthy trial whose outcome would have been in doubt, and achieved an unconditional victory for the prosecution.

During this same period of time, Mr. Mausner played a leading role in the denaturalization trial of Sergei Kowalchuk in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania. This trial ended recently, and we are awaiting a verdict. Whatever the verdict, the government's case was presented fully and professionally.

Mr. Mausner is also co-counsel in the deportation case against Boleslavs Maikovskis in New York, and has played a major role in the preparation and presentation of the government's case in that trial, which is now nearly complete. Mausner Nomination Page 2

Mr. Mausner's performance exemplifies his great devotion to duty, and I anticipate that he will continue to perform at this high level. Adequate funds are available for this award.

Jeffrey N. Mausner is recommended for a promotion from a GS-14, Step 5, to a GS-15. Mr. Mausner has been at the GS-14 level since he joined the Office of Special Investigations in July 1979.

Mr. Mausner joined OSI at its inception in 1979. He is a graduate of Cornell University Law School where he distinguished himself as a member of both the Law Review and the Order of the Coif. He received his Bachelor's degree from Brown University in 1972. From 1976 until he came to OSI, Mr. Mausner was a litigation associate at the New York law firm of Kaye, Scholer, Fierman, Hays & Handler.

Since joining OSI, Mr. Mausner has been one of our most competent and reliable trial attorneys, having been assigned to some of our most difficult cases, including Kowalchuk (presently awaiting en banc review in the Third Circuit) and Maikovskis (now on appeal in the Second Circuit). Mr. Mausner's performance in Maikovskis was particularly noteworthy. When OSI inherited the case from the SDNY it was in abominable shape; we were also faced with a biased, hostile and totally unpredictable immigration judge. The trial was particularly grueling and was stretched out over several months. While Mr. Mausner was theoretically second chair, he evolved into the leader of the Government's team. Although the trial judge ruled against OSI, Mausner was able to build a strong record, and prevailed upon the Board of Immigration Appeals to overturn the trial judge's decision. The case is presently before the Second Circuit; Mr. Mausner has prepared a superb brief on the Government's behalf.

In addition to his dogged perseverance in litigation, Mr. Mausner has spearheaded several major investigations which have resulted in numerous filings against members of notorious Nazi-sponsored units which had been engaged in mass murder and other persecution. In coordinating these investigations, Mr. Mausner supervises OSI historians, investigators, paralegals, and junior attorneys. He has done a superb job in coordinating these efforts.

Mr. Mausner is one of the best writers in the office. He has been responsible for numerous extensive and complicated post-trial and appellate briefs. Mausner's explication of facts is always thorough and his legal arguments are always lucid.

Mr. Mausner possesses extensive "institutional knowledge" of OSI and our legal theories. I have relied upon him on many occasions to help train new trial attorneys; he has performed extremely well in this training role.

In short, Mausner has been one of the most productive members of the OSI staff. His work output is virtually unparalelled in the office and his dedication to our work is second to none. His promotion to a GS-15 is altogether appropriate. Mr. Mausner has always received the highest rating available. A copy of his most recent rating is attached. Accordingly, I recommend that OSI trial attorney Jeffrey Mausner be promoted to a GS-15.
