The following is an article written by William Randolph Hearst for the New York Enquirer in answer to a request from that newspaper:

SAN SIMEON, Calif., Nov. 11, 1938. The New York Enquirer, 47 Walker street, New York.

THE shocking outrages perpetrated against harmless and helpless Jews in Germany are not the exhibition of any sporadic sentiment or action, not even directly attributable to the mad act of the irresponsible student who attacked the German government representative in Paris.

CERTAINLY all churches should unite to pray for liberty and tolerance, and all governments should unite to teach tolerance, justice and humanity.

All nations—all races—should unite to practice these fundamental principles of religion and civilization. The peoples of the earth must combine to agitate and labor for peace and unity—for friendship and mutual understanding—and not always for bitter competition and contention and antagonism and war.

WE AMERICANS must begin the great work, because we are the special beneficiaries of peace and tolerance and liberty.

It is time for another crusade to carry throughout the world the bright lamp that shines for all equally on the shores of our free land—the lamp of liberty and enlightenment, of equality and justice, of religion and humanity. It is time for a world-wide crusade—a crusade for twentieth century civilization.

BERLIN NAZIS FINE JEWS 400 MILLION FOR ENVOY DEATH

Series of Drastic Decrees Also Exclude Them From Social and Economic Life

BERLIN, Nov. 12.—(INS)—The Nazi regime tonight imposed a 400 million dollar fine on Germany's 400,000 Jews and through a series of drastic decrees pushed them to the edge of the Ghetto in legal retaliation for the slaying of a German diplomat in Paris.
