Mexico Basks Rec Plot to Assassinate Camacho

Three Killed in Gun Fights

Communists Open Fire on Soldiers and Police Squads in Two Raids MEXICO CITY, Nov. 30 (Saturday). (U.P.)—Authorities last night announced discovery of what they described as a communist plot to assassinate President-elect Manuel Avila Camacho on the eve of his inauguration after Federal soldiers and police had shot it out with armed groups in two different raids connected with uncovering the alleged plot.

Three persons were killed in the two shooting affrays and at least four wounded. The soldiers raided Communist party headquarters in an old colonial building scarcely half a block from the National Palace.

MAJOR KILLED Maj. Guillermo Garcia Gallegos was killed and at least two persons wounded in this raid.

Almost simultaneously the police were in another section of the capital engaged in a fierce gun battle with persons in the area. They were attempting to search because it was suspected it was being used as the meeting place of a subversive group.

ORGANIZATION SEEN Last night's incidents, following scarcely more than 24 hours after the Thursday night anti-American demonstration by a crowd of several hundred persons in front of the United States Embassy, caused speculation as to whether there might be some organized movement afoot to create an era of fright in the capital simultaneously with Avila Camacho's inauguration and the visit of United States Vice-President-elect Henry A. Wallace.

Details of the alleged plot against Avila Camacho were not disclosed.

ALMAZAN DENIAL Police said that the house they raided in a residential section in the southwestern part of the city allegedly was the meeting place of a group of Almazan followers of Gen. Juan Andreu Almazan, anti-administration Presidential candidate defeated by Avila Camacho last July.

Almazan, who returned here early this week from the United States to disclaim any designs on the Presidency, yesterday announced that he and his "sincere friends" had nothing to do with the demonstration in front of the United States Embassy in which Almazanists elements allegedly were involved.

Fourth Mystery Blast Shakes Valley Towns

Latest Baffling Explosion in San Fernando Area Accompanied by Unusual Flash of Light

Like a rocket from Mars, a mysterious explosion shook San Fernando, Valley towns last night, rattling windows, dishes and causing no damage.

The blast at 7:35 p.m. was the fourth in a series which, beginning Oct. 11, have baffled police and firemen.

The Valley Division Police Station at Van Nuys was flooded with calls from anxious residents inquiring about the strange tremor.

Stanley Foreman, motion picture projectionist, said he and Mrs. Foreman felt, heard and saw the explosion while they stood on the front porch of their home at 11444 Riverside Drive, at the corner of Tuolumne Blvd.

"It looked like a bomb flash such as we use at the studio," Foreman said. "It seemed to come several feet out of the ground, from one to three miles north of us. It was visible enough to light up the interior of our house, where the lights were turned off."

From Lankershim, Victory and Ventura Blvds. came reports that the explosion was distinct and not like a rumbling earthquake.

Police, however, gave some support to a quake theory. They said a Pasadena seismologist recently suggested that a tremor in a fault extending from Calaveras Pass might have ignited some gas pocket, causing a local disturbance affecting only a few square blocks.

A shock like this Oct. 11 annoyed many residents in the Studio City area, knocking a few from their beds in homes west of Laurel Canyon.

From the Lockheed aircraft factory at Burbank to the Hercules powder plant near Newcliff, police and firemen checked possible explosion sources without finding a clue.

Fred Jacobs, chief inspector for the Calaveras Pass Fire-ward, said no blasting had been done recently in the construction on this super highway from San Fernando Valley into Hollywood.

Women Help to Defeat 3000 Italian Troops

Greek Amazons Shower Rocks on Enemy Army Column From Peaks of Pindus Mountains

SALONIKA (Greece) Nov. 29. (AP)—An "Amazon company" of Macedonian peasant women who helped the Greek army defeat 3000 Italian troops by rolling rocks down on them from the peaks of the Pindus Mountains was described today in a Greek dispatch from the Epirus front.

More than 100 women were reported by a Greek correspondent to have followed a Greek army column, against the orders of an officer, and to have fought with the soldiers.

The correspondent quoted one middle-aged farm woman, Helen Codjani, who was wounded in the fighting, as telling him:

"A sergeant who passed through our village wanted to know the way to the Chapel of St. George. We told him and when he started off about 100 women took the trail after him.

When we neared the British camp and the Greek soldiers, when the officer saw us, he got very angry and ordered us to go back, but we started shouting, 'We shall not go back. We want to fight with you.'

"Since they wouldn't give us guns, we got hold of an ammunition magazine and trench mortars and we followed the soldiers to the high peaks of the mountains.

"During the night other women joined us. We didn't lose a single minute, and when night fell our troops had occupied all summits and we were waiting for the women to appear on the plateau of a mountain called Pournara.

"Next morning at 10 o'clock Italians appeared in a ravine below us. Our soldiers let them advance.

"When about 3000 enemies then entered the gorge, our soldiers started shooting. I cannot describe what followed.

"The Italians began to scatter and ran in all directions. Then we went into action and appeared at the extremity of the mountain and began throwing stones on the invaders. That was a terrible shower. When the sun set in the ravine there was not a single Italian alive.

IRON GUARD DEFIES Army in Raids on Many Provincial Cities BUDAPEST (Hungary) Nov. 29. (U.P.)—Fighting between the Rumanian army and Iron Guards in several cities is verging on widespread civil war, according to diplomatic advices received here tonight, and German intervention in Rumania is believed imminent.

In addition to clashes with the army, the Iron Guards, in raids in many Rumanian cities, were said to have murdered 2000 persons—mostly Jews—during the past three days.

TROOPS MARCH In Bucharest the boy King Mihail conferred with German generals, according to Rumanian dispatches, which do not mention widespread reports in other Balkan countries that Mihail fled the city seeking safety.

Already thousands of German troops have moved into the capital from provincial Rumania. In Hitler's first move toward taking over complete control of the tottering government.

Neutral observers here do not doubt that the Nazis will take more drastic steps if the bloody fighting between Iron Guards and Rumanian army forces continues much longer.

SAVAGE BATTLES Detachments of the pro-Nazi Iron Guard fought sharply with the Rumanian army at Brasov, Galatz, Ploesti, Craiova and Turnu-Severin and occupied public buildings, which news and Leftists are said to have been murdered. It was reported that Horia Sima, head of the Iron Guard, and Vice-Premier under Gen. Ion Antonescu, head of the Rumanian state, rushed there personally to restore order.
