Wind Fans Flames in Altadena Brush

Fire Sweeping Hills Back of Sanitarium; Residents Escape as Outlying Homes Burn

A howling wind which reached hurricane proportions in some spots roared out of the northwest last night fanning three disastrous fires on widely separated fronts of the Southland, ripping roofs off several homes in the foothill areas, and crippling power lines and communication systems for hours.
