Psalm 92

Mine eye also hath gazed on them that lie in wait for me; mine ears have heard my desire of the evil doers that rise up against me. The righteous shall flourish like the palm-tree; he shall grow like a cedar in Lebanon. Planted in the house of the Lord, they shall flourish in the courts of our God. They shall still bring forth fruit in old age; they shall be full of sap and richness; to declare that the Lord is upright, my Rock, in whom there is no unrighteousness.
