Winchell's Broadcast

On October 30, 1949 Walter Winchell made the following broadcast over the American Broadcasting Company stations:

"Mr. and Mrs. United States—Thanks to the blinding spotlight of newspaper and radio publicity this week, Americans were reminded of the public protection given by the free press. I refer to the fifty million dollars offered to a military school in Mississippi by George W. Armstrong, a miserable old man of 84. His sickening stipulation was that this military school, named for Thomas Jefferson, teach racial prejudice. The college trustees, who say that they turned it down, did not do so until the publicity exposed the slimy deal.

The thing that should burn you up and knock you cold is this. While decent Americans are paying the highest taxes in history, this hateful man's money is spent to destroy everything America stands for. And get this—his trust fund money of four and a half million bucks is not even taxed. I know some people who have paid four million dollars in the last 15 years in taxes. Some men who have the means of doing so much good on this earth prefer to be remembered by the meanness of their souls. Armstrong plans to have his hates live after him. Armstrong, the all American heel. He now threatens to open his own university to spread hatred in Texas. I don't believe Texans will stand for it, for one thing, and for another it would be outlawed anyhow by the courts as against public policy. And certainly not tax-exempt as an educational institution. Universities and schools and colleges are to spread knowledge, not ignorance. The greatest service this
