Switzerland Tour Letter #6

Tuesday.

ZÜRICH, den 25 Sept 1945

Dearest Shirley,

Hello again, honey. I haven't had a chance to write since Sunday as we have been moving a good deal. We left Lucerne by steamer Monday afternoon and went to Brunnen. From there we took a train to Zurich. We arrived in Zurich last night about seven, spent the night there and left about 2:15 this afternoon. Zurich is the largest city in Switzerland and has a population of 350,000.

We came from Zurich to Basel this afternoon and we are now to spend the night here. Right after breakfast in the morning we will go thru the customs and go back to the leave center in France.

This particular sheet of stationery is from the "Crown" hotel where we spent the night last night. The second sheet of this letter will be on stationery of the hotel here in Basel — Storehen — where I am to stay tonight. Now you will have stationery from each of the hotels I have stayed in while on forlough in Switzerland. The envelope is one I got while in Wengen and already have
