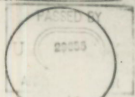

Dear Mother & Dad,

England.

I haven't heard from either of you in several days now, and I had just been digging on how often you were writing for awhile. However, I feel flattered that I got Dad to write one: since I have been over here. Maybe I can convince both of you to write again and often.

How is your work and how is everything at home? Have you heard anything about Buck Jessup lately? I wrote to him a few days after we arrived here and haven't heard from him yet. Also, I wrote to Golden twice since I have been here and have had no answer yet. I got a letter from him about a month ago which he had written to my old address in Virginia.

It seems that nearly everyone owes me a letter now because I wrote to almost all the folks since I have been in England. I still must write to Rudy and to Ellen and to a couple of soldier buddies.
