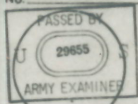

My Darling Wife,

Hello, honey. Hope that you are well and ok. I am fine. Some of us began working today with another unit to help them out and to learn something ourselves at the same time. We have to go to another camp by bus to work and then return by bus. We have to get up quite early to catch the bus and get back to camp at evening chow time so our day is pretty full. It seemed good to go to work again for a change.

Effective yesterday, I am promoted to a Private First Class. Twelve of us were promoted from Pvt to Pfc. Also, there were five other men promoted to Corporal and Sergeant.

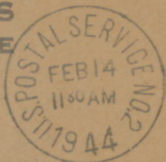
Now that I am a Pfc I will draw a base pay of fifty-four dollars a mo. plus 20% for overseas duty making a total of sixty-four dollars and eighty cents. After the allotments, insurance, bond deduction, and laundry are taken out of my pay I will draw about twenty-five dollars. I will actually draw this because I have allotted almost the limit for the pay I get. We are not allowed to allot our overseas pay, and we cannot allot all of our base pay but must draw at least ten dollars base pay.
