



20 DPA SERIES: THE NAZI HOLOCAUST - SERIES II — Jews from Eastern Europe were transported to death camps like Belzec, Treblinka, Auschwitz, Maidanek, Chelmno, and Sobibor in sealed box cars. (These death trains adhered to a strict timetable so as not to conflict with military trains.) Prisoners were locked in them for as long as 15 days and deprived of food, water, and sanitary facilities during transport. Consequently, scores died during the trip. Jews from Western Europe were often transported in second class coaches and were allowed to bring their families.
