



24 DPA SERIES: THE NAZI HOLOCAUST — A mass grave at a Nazi Concentration Camp, 1945. At the Nuremberg war crimes trial after the war, Sir Hartley Shawcross, chief prosecutor for England, estimated that the number of people killed in the concentration camps was 12,000,000 (this figure did not include other Nazi crimes like reprisal killings and the execution of hostages). The twelve million included 6,000,000 Jews. Adolph Eichmann's own assessment in a report to Himmler placed the number of Jews killed at 6 million (document XPS-2615, Nuremberg). In 1944 he said: "I shall leap into my grave laughing because the feeling that I have the death of five million people on my conscience will be for me a source of extraordinary satisfaction."
