b. 1897, Rheydtt (Rheinland); educated (at church expense) at Roman Catholic school and at university of Heidelberg (history and literature); no war service owing to physical disability (club-foot); pupil of famous Goethe scholar Gundolf; had originally left-wing sympathies and many Jewish friends; heroic exploits during French occupation of Ruhr probably invented later; tried unsuccessfully to make a living with his literary work (novels, plays, essays); connections with the small but very active Nazi group in the Ruhr since about 1923; 1924 speaker for the Party; manager of Gau Rheinland-Nord; 1925 editor "Nationalsozialistische Briefe"; protégé of the Strasser brothers; when the latter began to disagree with Hitler, he changed over to Hitler's side; was therefore made Gauleiter of Berlin 1927 with secret task of breaking the Strassers' supremacy in the Party in North Germany; founded and edited Berlin Party paper "Der Angriff" and succeeded in overcoming Strasser press undertakings; 1928 MdR; 1929 Reichspropaganda-leiter; 1933 Reich Minister of Propaganda; created Ministry and machinery of controlling all means of publicity; one of the most prominent Nazi leaders since his appointment to the Berlin Gau; has remained at the top and increased his influence throughout the years; beyond propagandistic work he is Chairman of the Inter-Ministerial Committee on air-raid damage relief; since May 1944 head of Berlin municipal administration; took prominent part in suppression on 20 July 1944 Putsch in Berlin; since 25 July Reich Plenipotentiary for total war effort; weekly editorials in "Das Reich," frequent speeches and broadcasts prove his skill as journalist and propagandist. b. 1889, Braunau, Austria; son of customs official; educated at six different schools, left in 1905 without passing final examination; 1908 unsuccessfully tried to enter Vienna Art Academy; 1908-14 various jobs in building trade, during these years became violently anti-Semitic; 1912 Munich; 1914 although Austrian citizen enlisted in 16th Reserve Regiment of Bavarian Army; 1914-18 served on Western Front as Company runner; later promoted Lance-Corporal (Gefreiter), was wounded in 1916 and gassed in 1918, the latter causing temporary blindness; on collapse of Germany decided to become politician; returned to regimental base and was employed for political work in München; Sept. 12 1919 attended meeting of "Deutsche Arbeiterpartei" and came into contact with anti-Semitic poet, Dietrich Eckart; reported favourably on "Party" and joined it 16 Sept.; was in charge of propaganda and spoke for first time, Feb. 1920; on outbreak of Kapp putsch, 1920, flew with Ludendorff and Epp on abortive journey to Berlin; dismissed from military service; July 1921 assumed leadership of Party, now called "NS. Arbeiterpartei"; 1922 served three months in prison following street brawls; 8 Nov. 1923 staged unsuccessful coup d'état in München, imprisoned; Jan. 1924 sentenced to five years imprisonment in Landsberg fortress; with Hess wrote "Mein Kampf," which was published 1925; Dec. 1924 released and recommenced political agitation; about 1930 obtained German citizenship as Regierungsrat to Brunswick Legation in Berlin; Sept. 1930 again appeared before a Court and swore oath that Nazi aims were legal and constitutional; 1931 gave interviews to foreign press and sent observers to international meetings; 1932 stood as candidate for Presidency against Hindenburg; during new elections in July conducted energetic campaign resulting in offer of post of Vice-Chancellor, which he refused; 30 Jan. 1933 on resignation of Schleicher, Hitler, with the help of v. Papen, appointed Reich Chancellor; 1934 carried out purge of unreliable elements in Party; met Mussolini for first time and in Aug., on death of Hindenburg, became head of State; 1935-39 carried out occupation of Saar, Rhineland, Austria, Sudetenland, Czechoslovakia and Memel; 1938 assumed command of Wehrmacht; Sept. 1939 first unsuccessful attempt on his life; Dec. 1941 took over command of Army; July 1944 second unsuccessful attempt on his life; 1 May 1945 death (in Berlin) reported, cause unknown.
